SIMPLE FUTURE

The Simple Future is used to talk about something that is supposed to happen in the future. It could be a plan, a promise or anything else for later.

USAGE



PLAN



PROMISES



PREDICT

The Simple Future is used to express actions that will happen later, allowing speakers to make predictions, promises, or plans.

FORMATION

Short form :

Subject + **'ll** + verb

AFFIRMATIVE

Subject + will +
verb

- It'll rain tomorrow.
- I will help you with your homework
- We will visit our grandparents next week.

Short form :

Subject + **won't** + verb

NEGATIVE

Subject + will +
not + verb

- I'll not start my work now
- She will not take everything for herself.
- It'll not take long.

QUESTION

Will + Subject +
verb

- Will you join us for dinner ?
- Will she be able to finish the work early ?
- Will i go to the party tomorrow ?

WOULD LIKE

It's a verb used for :

**TO
POLITELY
ASK FOR
SOMETHING
WE WANT**

**TO MAKE A
REQUEST**



FORMATION

Short form :

Subject + **'d** + like + [to]

AFFIRMATIVE

Subject +
would like +
[to] ...

- I'd like to drink some coffee.
- She would like some money for her makeup

Short form :

Subject + **wouldn't** +
like + [to]

NEGATIVE

Subject +
would not like
+ [to] ...

- I would not like to drink this water.
- We'd not like him to do it.

QUESTION

Would +
Subject + like
+ [to]

- Would you like to print this for us ?
- Would they like to come please ?

DON'T FORGET

WHEN YOU USE WOULD LIKE

The verb that comes after **would like** is supposed to be in the infinitive form

- I would not like to **drink** this water.
- We'd not like him to **do** it.

CONCLUSION
